

A great number of Deaf individuals use sign language as their first language and their way to communicate with the world. The role of a professional Sign Language Interpreter at schools. events, and medical appointments are essential for people that need that type of communication. And its not just words that an interpreter is conveying but also, the tone, emotions, structure and content of the message that is being delivered. People who are Deaf need this service and legally entitled to the accommodation. Their lives may depend on it.

Each person deserves the dignity of being understood, the right to express themselves. So, for years, LVCIL provided a Sign Language Interpretation referral service to our community. We work with many wonderful professional Sign Language Interpreters who capture the integrity of the language, and respect for those they sign for.

# We are back!

Community Inclusion for Young Children is back in action.

fter months of uncertainty caused by Pennsylvania's prolonged 2025 budget impasse, we are happy to announce that the Community Inclusion for Young Children project funded by the Pennsylvania Developmental Disabilities Council has resumed services! We are excited to once again offer free, family-centered supports to families across Pennsylvania. CIFYC is designed to help families feel informed, empowered, and supported while focusing on inclusion, advocacy, and providing families with the resources they need.

CIFYC offers a variety of services that families can access from the comfort of their home! We host monthly virtual parent support group meetings where parents can come together in a welcoming space to learn, share experiences, and connect with other families.

We also offer one-on-one sessions to support parents in navigating resources, accommodations, early childhood systems and much more. Last but not least, we provide families with peer mentorship, connecting families with other families who have similar experiences, offering support and shared understanding. With the return of CIFYC, families can expect the project to expand its offerings throughout 2026. As parents continue to reconnect with monthly parent support group meetings, the project aims to promote stronger advocacy skills, deeper community connections, and greater confidence in families navigating early childhood. As we enter 2026, be on the lookout for new things coming to CIFYC! We will continue to connect with organizations and businesses, such as amusement parks, to expand accessibility for families. We are also developing new ways to better support parents so that they have resources at the tip of their fingers.

## A Year of Choices

### **Another Year of Supported Decision Making**

#### How do you make decisions?

Do you rely on your experience alone? What if you don't know something? How do you weigh your options or even decide what questions to ask?

Supported Decision Making is a way of making choices and decisions about your own life, with the help from others. This help comes from a team of trusted people that you choose to become your circle of support. The circle of support can include friends, family members, mentors, or professionals. They are here to support vou!

It is natural to ask others for advice. This process is the same no matter the decision, although the amount of help someone needs varies by person. Decisions are made by you. For the past few years, LVCIL has run the **SDMPA.org** website and program, a project generously funded through the Pennsylvania Developmental Disabilities Council.


